

BEYOND120 ATLANTA EXCURSION 2025 IMPACT REPORT

Beyond120's 2025 career excursion to Atlanta visited major employers representing Fortune 500 & 1000 companies. This excursion also provided various professionalization opportunities, including networking with alumni and professional head shots to students in attendance.

- 15 undergraduate students from 9 different majors represented, from economics to psychology
- Alumni engagement opportunities with mentorship talks, young alumni networking and dinner with established alumni
- 93% of students said they better understand skills and professionalization in the corporate world
- 86% strongly agree that this excursion helped them better understand their potential career paths
- 93% found networking opportunities very valuable
